



Firearms Declaration

Steve Cegielski, All-Canada Show operations manager, offers helpful information on a hassle-free border crossing:

Veteran Canadian hunters know transporting firearms across the border is a very simple process. For first timers- the process is pain-free, and the non-resident firearm forms are available on AllCanada.com.

Complete the one page document including personal and firearm information and serial numbers. Remember not to sign the form; a border-crossing official must witness the signature when declaring the firearm at the Canadian border.

Each hunter is allowed to transport three firearms across the border with one simple form, for a \$25.00 Canadian fee. Since there is no extra charge to cross the border with up to 3 firearms I recommend taking along one back up firearm for every two hunters in the group. Example: six hunters equals nine firearms crossing the border. Better safe than sorry after you slip and smash your gun on the rocks the first day.

Each hunter must complete the firearm declaration form and transport their own firearm across the border. One hunter can't transport three firearms for three hunters and only pay the one declaration fee. I've asked that question.

Don't let misinformation about Canadian firearm declaration be a determining factor on taking that Canadian hunt of a lifetime. It's not really an issue if you follow the simple rules of border crossing.
